Judging from this rising interest in translation history, this book on traditional Chinese fiction in Asia, which sets the question of Asian translations into a general framework, and so far has no equivalent, is still of service to researchers.

**Traditional Birthing Practices of Nyuh Kuning, Gianyar Regency, Bali, Indonesia** Institute of Southeast Asian Studies

This book takes stock of the results of some two decades of intensive archaeological research carried out on both sides of the Bay of Bengal, in combination with renewed approaches to textual sources and to art history.
